David Briggs is Organist Emeritus of Gloucester Cathedral, where he directed the music for eight years. While at Gloucester, he directed the Three Choirs Festivals, conducting some of the UK's finest singers and professional orchestras. A gifted and inspirational teacher, David gives masterclasses at Oxford and Cambridge. He now lives in Ipswich, Massachusetts.

In addition to being a conductor and prolific composer, he is an internationally renowned organist who has built a worldwide reputation as an innovative musician and dazzling performer. Mr. Briggs will play an organ concert on the Friday evening of the Carolina Course.

Mr. Briggs is thrilled about working with the girls, men and women of the Carolina Course. He has selected music by Stanford, Elgar, Wood, Lauridsen, Rose and Briggs for the Course's closing Eucharist and Choral Evensong.

Robert Ridgell, Course Organist

Robert P. Ridgell, one of America's highly acclaimed church musicians, is the Director of Music of the historic Cathedral of Saint Paul in the Twin Cities. Prior to this appointment, Mr. Ridgell was Organist and Director of Music Education of Trinity Wall Street, NYC. He has held positions in cathedrals and churches throughout the United States including the Cathedral of the Madeleine, Salt Lake City and the Cathedral Church of the Savior, Philadelphia.

A native of Charlotte, NC, Mr. Ridgell began his organ study with David Lowry, then attended Indiana University School of Music (Bloomington) where he studied with Marilyn Keiser. Mr. Ridgell graduated from Westminster Choir College with his Master of Music degree. At Westminster, he studied with Stefan Engels. Mr. Ridgell studied organ improvisation in Germany, during which time he was a finalist in the American Guild of Organists National Competition in Organ Improvisation.
